







88.2% of women surveyed in 2010 had seen the INCEF films or had discussed them with someone who had. 96.3% of women surveyed in 2012 had done so. Of these, a majority in both years said that the films influenced their consumption of great apes.

(Note: This graph does not measure change. Instead, it shows that for both years, a majority of women surveyed said the films influenced them.) **Results Displayed Graphically**


The percentage of men who said they hunted either chimpanzees or gorillas decreased significantly.



Percentage of men who hunt...




